

VIEWPOINT PROJECT - BOX 1

This project consists of 10 items, housed in a box of about 12” x 12” x 6”. The objective is to have one or more of the items photographed in 3D by different members of CSC at their homes. Each photographer will be able to give his or her own interpretation and vision by assembling the objects as he or she wishes to create a unique way of seeing the same objects differently. The results should be interesting as each person may see a different way of capturing the same objects in a fresh way.

Participating members must follow these rules without exception:


1. The box may be borrowed for only one week, from Saturday to Saturday and must be returned with all 10 objects in perfect shape.
2. Participants should use at least one of the items from the box and up to all 10. No other external objects may be used in this project.
3. The items must not be physically damaged, altered, changed or otherwise tampered with.
4. The objects must be photographed against a perfectly uniform and solid background, such as what professional photographers call a seamless drop. The background may be any solid color.
5. The photographer may take as many pictures, in as many settings he/she wishes, but only 3 final pictures will be allowed in the final show-off and display.
6. When all participating members have finished the project, the pictures will be collected, turned into a projected show and displayed to the club on one or more occasion. If the results are successful, the show may be converted to a print show to be displayed at the 3D Center.
7. The original images should have sufficient resolution so they can be used in either a projected or printed exhibition.
8. A CSC club member who has signed up for the project will be placed on a routing schedule. If a participant must miss his/her turn, the box will go to the next person on the list, and the person who has missed a turn will be able to catch up but only at the end of the tour.

Questions regarding the rules, or about logistics should be addressed to Shab Levy, the coordinator of the project. If this project is successful, it is planned to have more and different boxes in the future.




3. PLASTIC TUBE
